1H have had the most fabulous, interesting and exciting start to this term: On Wednesday they had their first Forest School session where they uncovered some enormous larvae inside some rotting wood. They found out that they were the larvae from Giant Stag Beetles, plus on Thursday, they went on their Spring walk to Scadbury Park. Whilst they were there they explored the woods and identified lots of different woodland flowers and plants. They also went off the main path and discovered carpets of bluebells under the trees, which smelt beautiful and looked like a 'magical forest'. Thank you very much to the parents whom accompanied the class too, your support is always much appreciated. Year 3 enjoyed their history workshop introducing them to the changes to life in the 20th Century. They learned how leisure and entertainment has changed over time and how music, fashion and holidays developed and became more important to people's lives. Year 5 enjoyed a history workshop on Crime and Punishment which involved a great deal of role play and storytelling. They learnt about the use of prisons across time, how social hierarchy affected the level of punishment received, and how criminals were punished throughout the following time periods: Ancient Egypt, Romans, Mayans, Anglo-Saxons, and Victorians up to modern times. Year 6 and Year 5 were visited by the NSPCC who talked to them about their personal safety, how the charity can support them and they discussed different scenarios and how to respond and actions to take.
